Did you know...

St George's Church has just celebrated it's 158th birthday? This quote is taken from the book "80 Years" published to celebrate our 80th birthday in 1948: "On Friday, July 10th 1868, St George's Church was consecrated by Bishop Gilbert, the then Bishop of Chichester. The United Choirs of Broadwater, The Chapel of Ease (now St Paul's) and Christ Church, supplied the choral portion of the Services. "The Church was designed by the late Mr George Truffitt, and then stood quite by itself, Farncombe Villa [*in Farncombe Road*] being it's nearest neighbour."
